Women are Joining the VFW

arch is Women's History Month, and the VFW has a lot to celebrate. We have seen impressive growth in the number of women veterans joining — and actively participating — over the last several years. Women members in the VFW are taking active leadership roles at the organization's top levels, too.

As of early January, VFW's Membership Department reported that more than 42,000 women were VFW members. That is an increase of more than 54 percent since 2019.

That surge in female membership is illustrated in VFW's national leadership. You'll notice the cover of this month's issue of *VFW* magazine includes VFW's Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief Carol Whitmore, who is in line to become the first woman to lead this great organization later this year. Pictured with Carol is Debra Anderson, who was the first woman to serve as VFW's Quartermaster General, which is the organization's top financial officer, from 2016-2022.

I am thrilled with the number of women joining our great organization. Their inclusion in VFW's ranks and leadership make us a stronger, more diverse force to help veterans and their families.

An example is the recent passage of *The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act*, which is now *Public Law 118-210*. VFW's hard work getting this approved will help 7.8 million transitioning service members, veterans, caretakers and survivors. We are glad it passed, but let's not forget that veterans and their families waited needlessly while members of Congress played to their parties' bases.

In recognition of the unique needs, challenges and interests of female veterans, we recently established the VFW Women Veterans Advisory Committee. My hope is this committee will grow in importance as more women join.

Women are a growing segment of the veterans population. In 2023, VA reported that there were 2.1 million women veterans, which represented 11.3 percent of the total veterans population. VA estimates that by 2043, women will represent 17.2 percent of all veterans.

This is a trend we recognize and embrace. We want the VFW membership to be an accurate representation of the people who served the nation in uniform. The growing participation of women in the U.S. military and their service to the nation and their communities as active veterans should be shown in VFW's ranks.

As I conclude, I want to give a special shout-out to all Vietnam War veterans. The nation observes National Vietnam War Veterans Day on March 29. I salute all my fellow veterans of that war and remember the sacrifices of those who never came home.

Two Airmen Receive Silver Stars

An Air Force pilot and his jet's weapons systems officer both earned Silver Stars for their actions last April in the skies over Israel. The two Air Force officers, Maj. Benjamin Coffey, the pilot of an F-15E, and Capt. Lacie Hester, the weapons systems officer, were recognized for helping to fight off more than 300 ballistic and cruise missiles, as well as one-way attack drones, launched by Iran targeting Israel.

In total, 30 U.S. troops received military decorations for their actions during the April 13-14, 2024, fight. The Air Force hosted a ceremony in November at Royal Air Force Base Lakenheath in England to present the medals. The other awards presented were:

- 14 Distinguished Flying Crosses
- 6 commendation medals



- 6 Air and Space Achievement Medals
- 2 Bronze Stars

With her receipt of the Silver Star, Hester is the third woman to receive the nation's third-highest award for valor in combat since World War II. Air Force Capt. Benjamin Coffey, both of whom received the Silver Star, were among 30 U.S. troops who received awards for their actions in the Middle East in April 2024.

Vietnam War Dustoff Crews Honored With Gold Medal

Soldiers who helped get wounded troops quickly off the battlefields during the Vietnam War received official recognition last September when then-President Joe Biden signed the Dustoff Crews of the Vietnam War Congressional Gold Medal Act (P.L. 118-87).

The medal recognizes all pilots, crew chiefs and medics "who served honorably during the Vietnam War aboard helicopter air ambulances." They were recognized at a Sept. 26 ceremony hosted by the U.S. Army Medical Center of Excellence at the Army Medical Department Museum at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

Dustoff crews are credited with saving more than 900,000 lives during the war.

VFW PRIORITY GOALS FOR 2025 WHERE VFW STANDS ON THE ISSUES

Listed below are VFW's official positions on issues impacting veterans, service members and their families, as well as national defense and homeland security. They are based on national convention resolutions and rated as priorities by direct feedback from VFW members.

BUDGET

To fully fund relevant programs for veterans, service members and their families, Congress must:

- Ensure sufficient, timely appropriations and proper budget oversight for VA.
- Authorize VA to receive reimbursements from TRICARE and Medicare
- Never reduce one veteran's benefits to pay for another.
- Modernize and reform VA and DOD programs that do not meet the needs of service members, veterans and families.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE AND MEMORIAL AFFAIRS

To ensure veterans and their survivors have timely access to earned benefits, Congress and VA must:

- Crack down on unaccredited claims consultants known as claim sharks.
- Study all toxic and environmental exposures, and implement programs to ensure health care and benefits are provided to all exposed service members and veterans.
- Properly oversee and update the modernized appeals process, digital claims processing and antiquated examination process.
- Increase Dependency and Indemnity Compensation, burial allowances and other benefits for survivors.
- Improve the accuracy of disability compensation claims related to military sexual trauma.
- Ensure that earned VA benefits are never unjustly reduced.

EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT AND TRANSITION ASSISTANCE

To ensure veterans succeed after leaving military service, Congress, VA, DOD, and DOL must:

- Improve education benefits through modernized online student housing allowances, child care stipends, parity for Guard and Reserve members and elimination of delimiting dates.
- Enhance outreach and counseling to veterans eligible for the Veteran Readiness and Employment program.
- Ensure parity of VA and DOD education programs with other federal programs.
- Expand small business, hiring preference, tax incentives and entrepreneurship resources for veterans and military spouses.
- Increase funding for HUD-VASH vouchers, grant and per diem payments and pilot programs to combat veteran homelessness.
- Conduct oversight of VA's Transition Assistance Program to ensure compliance with the law and require the inclusion of accredited claims representatives.
- Eliminate government bureaucratic delays preventing effective use of education and employment benefits.

HEALTH CARE

To ensure service members and veterans receive timely access to high-quality health care without increasing cost shares, Congress, VA and DOD must:

- Eliminate service member and veteran suicide.
- Reform the dysfunctional community care program at VA.
- Strengthen care and research for mental health and traumatic brain injuries.
- Research the efficacy of plant-based alternative therapies for PTSD.
- Improve oversight of Vet Centers to ensure adequate staffing, resources and funding.
- Enhance programs and services for women and underserved veterans.
- Preserve the integrity of TRICARE.
- Properly implement VA and DOD health IT systems.
- Expand nursing home eligibility and long-term care options.
- Modernize care for veterans outside of the United States.

MILITARY READINESS

To maintain a strong and ready all-volunteer force capable of protecting American interests, Congress and DOD must:

- Enhance quality-of-life and health care programs that allow service members to focus on the mission.
- Ensure equity of benefits for Reserve Component service members.
- End the military retirement pay and VA disability compensation offset.
- Provide benefit enrollment for all transitioning service members.
- Eliminate sexual assault and harassment from the military.
- Increase military base pay comparability with private sector wages.
- Ensure that military housing and work spaces are safe and modern.
- Eliminate food insecurity in the military.

NATIONAL SECURITY, FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND POW/MIA

To fully support the all-volunteer force, protect our nation's citizens and defend American interests around the world, Congress and DOD must:

- Ensure the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency is fully funded to perform its personnel recovery mission.
- Deter threats to our national security by supporting our allies in Ukraine, Israel, Korea and Taiwan.
- Ensure all service members who served in harm's way to include foreign nationals, translators and allies —receive the recognition, care and benefits they may have earned.

VFW Celebrates Passage of Dole Act

Thanks in large part to the advocacy of VFW, The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, also known as P.L. 118-210, was officially signed into law by then-President Joe Biden on Jan. 2.

The *Dole Act* will expand VA benefits, modernize health care delivery, and reduce bureaucratic delays that prevent veterans, caregivers and other beneficiaries from receiving the care and services they deserve.

Furthermore, this new law will:

- Expand caregiver benefits for elderly and infirmed veterans.
- Increase the cap for in-home care programs.
- Fix community care options for veterans outside of the VA healthcare system.
- Extend timelines, eligibility and availability for certain GI Bill programs.
- Provide funding for family caregiver mental health services and sheltering homeless veterans.

Not Just A Number Act included as a provision within this comprehensive package, we believe the Dole Act also will help reduce veteran suicide," said VFW Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt. "We commend those members of Congress whose dedication and leadership garnered the bipartisan support in getting this flagship, bicameral veterans package passed on to the President's desk."

VFW championed the *Dole Act* from day one. Whether it was talking with members of Congress, hosting press

conferences or calling on its membership to contact individual lawmakers, VFW was a leader in the charge to pass this vital piece of legislation.

"Continuing to pass legislation like this signals to the more than one million service men and women in the Armed Forces to include the thousands currently deployed to war zones throughout the Middle East and the Horn of Africa, that Congress and the Administration will honor the contract which all service members and veterans signed," Lipphardt said.



Recognize Vietnam War Veterans on March 29

March 29 is National Vietnam War Veterans Day. It marks the day in 1973 when all U.S. ground troops departed Vietnam. Only U.S. embassy personnel and support staff remained in South Vietnam until the fall of Saigon on April 30, 1975.

This day is set aside for Americans to recognize every Vietnam War veteran to include those who are still unaccounted for.

From February 1961 to May 1975, more than 3.4 million Americans served in support of U.S military operations in Vietnam and Southeast Asia. More than 58,000 gave their lives, and nearly 1,580 service men remain unaccounted for, according to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency.



VA Adds Presumptive Service Connections

As of January, VA has established presumptive service connections for urinary bladder, ureter and related genitourinary caners, leukemias, multiple myelomas, myelodysplastic syndromes and myelofibrosis.

Eligible veterans must have served on active military, naval, air or space service in Somalia or the Southwest Asia theater of operations on or after Aug. 2, 1990; or in Afghanistan, Syria, Djibouti, Uzbekistan, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon or Yemen on or after Sept. 11, 2001.

s March is set aside as Women's History Month, VFW can think of no better time to recognize the Military Women's Memorial in Arlington, Va.

Located at the ceremonial entrance to Arlington National Cemetery, the memorial opened in October 1997. VFW members donated \$70,000 toward the \$21.5 million project. The memorial is a half-circle of granite, 30 feet high and 226 feet in diameter, with the Great Seal of the United States on the ground in the center.

Seals of the armed services are set in gold leaf on the ceremonial gateway. In the center of the memorial's semicircle is a 60,000-gallon reflecting pool that represents the pooling of women's voices over the course of history.

A 33,000-square-foot education center includes an exhibit

gallery which chronicles the collective story of women's service to the nation, a Hall of Honor, gift shop, and the Vaught Center, a multipurpose conference center.

The heart of the memorial is the Register, a one-of-a-kind, interactive database which tells the individual stories of women who have served. It currently houses nearly 317,000 individual records of women's service.

'INCREDIBLE GATHERING OF WOMEN VETERANS'

Last October, VFW Senior Vice Commanderin-Chief Carol Whitmore attended the Patriot Leadership Award Gala at the Military Women's Memorial.

Representing the VFW, Whitmore and VFW Legislative Deputy Director Kristina Keenan joined members of Congress, leaders in the military community and others at the gala of which the Daughters of the American Revolution was the presenting sponsor.

The purpose of the gala was to recognize women and men whose actions and leadership have paid tribute to and empowered U.S. military members. This year's award recipients were actors Kerry Washington and Sean Astin.

"Award-winning actors, activists, advocates, philanthropists and steadfast supporters of our men and women in uniform as well as our veteran community, both Ms. Washington and Mr. Astin are exceptionally deserving recipients of this prestigious award," said retired Army CW5 Phyllis Wilson, the Memorial Foundation president.

Washington most recently starred in the film "The Six Triple Eight," as Army Maj. Charity Adams (Earley). Adams led the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, which was the only predominately Black Women's Army Corps unit to serve overseas during World War II. In 2022, the 6888th was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal.

"I felt like these women were with us in the process," Washington said during filming. "You felt their spirit all the time."

Astin served as the Army's ambassador from 1995-2005. In 2022, Army Secretary Christine Wormuth awarded Astin CASA Emeritus status — a lifetime designation — for his continued support of service members and their families.

"I hope to support the recruiting command with creativity and purpose," Astin said upon receiving the title.

Whitmore, who is on track to become VFW's first-ever female commander-in-chief this summer, said she enjoyed seeing other women warriors and hearing their accomplishments and contributions to the military.

"The highlight for me was spending time with other fellow veterans," Whitmore said. "This was especially true at the end of the evening listening to Taps played on bagpipes with my friend, Phyllis Wilson, the director of the memorial."

Keenan said a poignant moment for her was meeting former POW Shoshana Johnson, who had been captured in Iraq in 2003.

"I had the honor to spend time with her, and she spoke in detail about being wounded and captured," Keenan said. "She also described how she was rescued and said that she remains close friends with the U.S. soldiers who risked their lives to bring her to safety. Meeting her and hearing her story was one of the most memorable and moving interactions I've ever had.

"It was an incredible gathering of women veterans, particularly those who continue to be leaders in their civilian lives. We have many shared experiences, including not always being seen as 'real' veterans."

A Vietnam veteran, Joe was based at Long Thanh North from 1969-1971 with the 210th Combat Aviation Battalion, 1st Aviation Brigade. He joined the VFW in 1977 while he was stationed in Lawton, Okla.

"During our morning breakfast, we just chit-chat about how we can help each other's organization," said Joe, who has been married to Lori for seven years. "But we respect each other's position. Joe is quick to commend his wife, a two-time cancer survivor, for being an inspiration to other women who are just beginning their own cancer journeys. He said Lori plays softball and has been a bowler for 26 years, including competing twice in Reno, Nev., in the national championship games.

"A significant milestone for our Post was the conversion to a non-smoking establishment," Joe said. "Despite nay sayers stating otherwise, our Post is thriving and is a hub of camaraderie."

MARCH IS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

During the month of March, the VFW pays special tribute to the trailblazing women who have admirably served our country in uniform. Their service paved the way for the newest generation of female veterans. March 29 also commemorates National Vietnam War Veterans Day. Featured is Army Nurse Corps Lt. Diane Carlson, one of the approximately 7,500 U.S. service women who served in Vietnam. To all women veterans, VFW salutes you.

Carlson, now Diane Carlson Evans, served in the burn unit of the 36th Evacuation Hospital in Vung Tau and at Pleiku with the 71st Evacuation Hospital, 30 miles from the Cambodian border in the Central Highlands. Carlson Evans went on to create the Vietnam Women's Memorial Project in 1984. The Vietnam Women's Memorial was dedicated in 1993 because of this group. The bronze sculpture depicts three uniformed women with a wounded soldier. One nurse comforts the soldier, one kneels and one looks upward. Carlson Evans is a life member of VFW Post 4393 in Helena, Mont.



VFW magazine continues its "Destination Post Series" this month. The series will feature 125 VFW Posts located in sought-after tourist destinations. Featured VFW Posts are those that make a real difference in the communities in which the Posts are located. This month's article takes VFW magazine to two coastal cities in Georgia and South Carolina.

Renowned for its rich blend of art, history and antebellum architecture, the charming city of Savannah, Ga., exudes a unique sense of permanence that extends to its large veterans' population. With an active Auxiliary, Riders Group and Military Order of the Cootie, the Post offers its members and visiting veterans ample opportunities for engagement and camaraderie.

"We strive to maintain an atmosphere of openness and inclusion within our veterans community," VFW Post 660 Commander Charles Fillyaw said. "Whatever your background or current situation, we want all veterans to know they are welcome here."

For Fillyaw, the southern hospitality and warm decorum his membership extends to all who visit Post 660 is a source of personal pride, tied to why he joined in 2018.

"I had just lost my best friend, and I really needed to be around veterans," Fillyaw said. "When I walked through the doors of Post 660, I got exactly what I needed. Since taking over as commander, I have welcomed everyone who walks through the door. The members of the Post and Auxiliary all do the same thing. That, to me, is why our Post is so special."

Since 2016, Post 660 has been part of the backdrops for six major motion pictures to date, including Adam Sandler's "The Do-Over" (2016), "Galveston" (2018), "Peanut Butter Falcon" (2019) and "Halloween Ends" (2022), as well as the recent releases of Tyler Perry's "Divorce in the Black" (2024) and Clint Eastwood's "Juror #2" (2024).

'SO MUCH TO REMEMBER ABOUT THE SIGNIFICANCE OF OUR WAR'

A VFW Post member in Missouri spearheaded the state's first *Operation Desert Storm* commemoration ceremony to honor those who fought alongside him.

Then members of VFW Post 1828 and their families gathered at the Veterans Memorial in West Plains, Mo., to commemorate the 33rd anniversary of the end of *Operation Desert Storm* last year, it marked an historic first for the "Show-Me State" Post.

Led by Gulf War veteran and Post 1828 Junior Vice Commander David Scott Buennemeyer, the ceremony on Feb. 28, 2024, honored the poignant stories of two pilots from his unit who were killed in action. It also included the recitation of the names of 10 Missourians who made the ultimate sacrifice.

"I feel our war is the modern forgotten war, much like the Korean War," said Buennemeyer, a retired Air Force master sergeant who led a ground combat unit during *Desert Storm*. "It is a story that I believe has been eclipsed by the Iraq and Afghanistan era, but there is so much to remember about the significance of our war."

Buennemeyer, who served during the Gulf War with Echo Flight of the 50th Security Police Group out of Hahn Air Base in Germany, decided to organize Missouri's first *Desert Storm* ceremony following his arrival to the state in 2022.

A former District 9 commander for the VFW Department of Illinois, Buennemeyer participated for nearly a decade in the state's annual Desert Storm Remembrance ceremony, which takes place each February at the Illinois State Capitol Rotunda in Springfield to commemorate its 17 service members killed in combat.

"I was involved with state political leaders and state veterans' affairs leaders at every ceremony for over eight years," said Buennemeyer, a former member of VFW Post 5506 in Marseilles, Ill. "I also held annual Post and District-level *Desert Storm* ceremonies at the Middle East Conflicts Wall Memorial in Marseilles, the only memorial built while the wars were being fought."

Buennemeyer believes the inaugural ceremony last year, which was concluded with a rendition of Taps by Post 1828 Commander Dan Brown, also provided others in the state with a model for how Posts and towns can honor and celebrate their Gulf War veterans.

Buennemeyer intended to host a second annual ceremony at the Veterans Memorial in West Plains this Feb. 28. As of the completion of this article in January, his goal was to expand public coverage and invite state VFW leadership, congressmen and senators.

"I want my new state to know and honor the sacrifice of its citizens and to hold annual remembrance ceremonies," Buennemeyer said. "We can never forget each and every person who paid the ultimate price. We need to read their names out loud and remember them."





Prom honoring the legacy of its namesake, Robert Jack, to starting modern initiatives such as a monthly hiking program, a 100-year-old VFW Post in Arkansas continues to carry on Post traditions of community service and fellowship.

Founded on Feb. 13, 1925, VFW Post 1322 in Van Buren, Ark., is the oldest VFW Post in the state and in recent years has flourished into a hub for veterans and their families. Van Buren, a suburb of Fort Smith, is in western Arkansas near the Oklahoma state line.

Post 1322 Commander Matthew Hicks said that members focus on community activities, which he said has led to more engagement.

"We're going into our third year with a project called Operation Daily," said Hicks, currently a medic with the Army National Guard. "We now have our building open every day. Folks can come in, have a cup of coffee, eat a donut, play some games, watch TV, use one of our computers or have conversations with others. This Post is a community center — not a canteen."

'A CHANCE TO EXPERIENCE NATURE'

Hicks said that one of the Post's priorities is the Hiking for Mental Health program, which was established in 2019. He said it allows veterans to connect with nature and build camaraderie among other hikers. Hicks said that each month, hikers meet at the Post and then carpool to a hiking location.

"Arkansas is under rated when it comes to the beauty of the state," Hicks said. "We don't do hard hikes, so people of all ages are welcome to come, even if they are not veterans. We make sure everyone gets a chance to experience nature in their own way and deal with whatever thoughts they have."



Post History Ties to VFW Founder

James Putnam, VFW's first Commander-in-Chief and co-founder of the organization, attended the grand opening of VFW Post 1322 in Van Buren, Ark., in February 1951 on the 26th anniversary of its establishment.

According to Post 1322 archives, Putnam, who lived his later years in Arkansas, "personally installed the officers of the Post in the new building." Putnam's remains were buried at Arkansas' Fayetteville National Cemetery.

Other Post 1322 initiatives include donating to the Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots program, flag retirement ceremonies and adopting two Van Buren cemeteries – Gill Cemetery and Gracelawn Cemetery. Volunteers laid nearly 1,000 wreaths at the cemeteries in December.

"Public fundraising campaigns helped us purchase those wreaths," Hicks said. "We laid them at the headstones of four of the Post's founding members and all the other service members in those cemeteries."

'IT'S AMAZING WHAT THEY'VE DONE'

Hicks attributed the longevity of the Post to its strong community ties and active involvement. He added that if it were not for a few of the Post's older members "holding it together," the

facility and its contribution to the community would not be here in the present day.

Korean War veteran Robert Layes was one of those members. The Navy veteran, who served aboard the USS Kearsarge (CVA-33), said the Post is a "completely different place" now that younger veterans have joined.

"It's amazing what they've done with the place," said Layes, who served from 1950 to 1954. "I don't get to go as much anymore, but I still participate sometimes."

Layes, 93, added that he appreciates newer members for growing the Post into what it is today.

"I am very proud to be a VFW member," Layes said. "Our Post has changed for the better, and I'm happy it has."

'It's What Service Members Need'

VFW service officers at Benefits Delivery at Discharge (BDD) sites provide a simplified process for service members who are separating from the military. The BDD site at Virginia's Naval Station Norfolk helps those troops during the process.

Being the largest Navy base in the world, Naval Station Norfolk in Virginia is home to a vast number of sailors and Marines, and VFW's Benefits Delivery at Discharge (BDD) site on the base provides an essential service to those military members.

VFW National Pre-Discharge Claims Representative Abigail Heffernan said that a common concern among troops is how "daunting" the VA claims process is.

"Having BDD representatives on military bases can alleviate the stressor of getting VA claims done — and done right," Heffernan said. "Filing a disability claim also provides supplemental income to service members during a very critical period in their transition from military life."

Heffernan, a retired Navy career counselor, said that she mostly gets "word-of-mouth" referrals and gives briefings about the claims process during Transition Assistance Program (TAP) classes. Heffernan added that, as one of VFW's BDD representatives, she undergoes service officer training every six months, all while processing about five claims per day.

Heffernan said that, even as a career counselor, she quickly realized during

her transition out of the military that it was going to be more difficult than she anticipated.

"While in the Navy, I was responsible for preparing sailors for separation out of the military," Heffernan said. "I felt that I was pretty good at my job and that I was well-prepared for my transition. But there were so many things that needed to be done and very little direction on how to do it. This is an example why BDD sites are so important. It's what service members need."

TBI App Offers Tools for Medical Providers

More than half a million service members have suffered a traumatic brain injury in the past 25 years.

ssistance for military service members and veterans with a traumatic brain injury — also known as a TBI — is continuing to expand through the Military Health System. A recent addition to these resources is the Warfighter Brain Health Provider Toolkit app, released last year.

Designed as a resource hub for Military Health System providers, the smartphone app offers health care providers an easy way to access tools that assist in assessment, evaluation and treatment of individuals with mild TBIs as well as patients with symptoms related to a potential threat to the brain.

One advantage of the Warfighter Brain Health Provider app is that it is accessible offline and can be used in any environment or location. The app was developed by experts at the Traumatic Brain Injury Center of Excellence, a Defense Department office offering care, support and research for TBIs.

Through the app, caregivers are able to proceed in a logical order through the steps of TBI evaluation. This valuable tool also offers an information summary designed to assist in injury management and treatment.

Dr. Stephanie Maxfield-Panker, clinical affairs section chief for the Defense Health Agency's Traumatic Brain Injury Center of Excellence, recently shared additional information about the app and the importance of ensuring that these tools are easily accessible to providers in an article from the Military Health System website.

"Medical personnel will have brain health resources in one location, at



their fingertips, in the deployed setting, in garrison or home base, online or offline," she said. "It is important for medical personnel to always have the most up-to-date tools they need to assess and manage TBI and other brain health threats — anytime, anywhere."

Traumatic brain injuries are common among veterans and active military service members, according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Worldwide, the Department of Defense estimates that approximately 509,000 individuals suffered a TBI from 2000 to 2024. Of these injuries, close to 82 percent were considered mild, around 12 percent were classified as moderate, and 2.1 percent were either severe or penetrating.

By definition, TBIs are an injury to the head which disrupts the person's brain function. More serious brain injuries may result in ongoing symptoms or chronic health issues, such as depression and post-traumatic stress disorder.

These injuries can be the result of motor vehicle accidents, falls or an incident involving a sudden blow or jolt to the head, according to the VA. Veterans who believe they have suffered a TBI are encouraged to contact their nearest VA health care facility for a comprehensive screening.

Annually during March, the Brain Injury Association of America and the Defense Department promote Brain Injury Awareness Month to help educate the public about this medical condition and to share resources available to service members, veterans, family members and health care professionals.

The TBI Center of Excellence website also is a valuable resource for patients and their families. The website includes an informational booklet and fact sheets on specific TBI issues and treatments, along with helpful guides for patients and caregivers.





Women in VFW Share Ideas for Growth Potential

Assuming females are not eligible for membership in VFW is a hurdle many women vets still face.

BY JANIE DYHOUSE



s the number of women serving in uniform has grown significantly over the past 25 years, so, too, has the number of female VFW members. At press time, VFW has nearly 41,000 women members. That is nearly 14,000 more than in 2019 when the organization finished the year with 27,281 female members.

VFW magazine asked women leaders in the organization as well as those employed by VFW their thoughts on what more VFW can do to attract more female vets. The most common responses included continuing to make the Posts more "family-friendly" and offering child care during Post meetings.

The comments from those who responded to our request are as follows and have been edited for length.

VFW EMPLOYEES

Donna Yawn | Pre-Discharge Rating Representative, NVS

"I think it would be beneficial and important to show that more women and women of color are in leadership positions within the VFW. I joined the VFW when I was in the Army stationed in Hawaii. I joined the VFW because of the camaraderie I witnessed and seeing VFW help active-duty service members who were in need."

Cynthia Archuleta | Regional Quality Assurance Specialist, NVS

"Many female veterans are never asked about what they did. By the time someone else may say 'Oh she served,' it's too late. man served. We must ask every female if they served before we just assume they are a spouse of a veteran. This question should be as common as asking a male."

Brittany Dymond Murray | Associate Director, VFW Communications and Public Affairs

"It's going to take time for VFW to appeal to more women veterans. Depending on what their service looked like, they may fear a repeat of an in-service experience. We must do better telling the stories of women veterans engaged in VFW from the Post to national levels, and not just during specific times of the year. I joined my first Post because it was part of the student veteran community at the university I attended immediately after I was discharged from the Navy. Upon joining the Post, I was quickly welcomed, accepted and integrated into Post leadership roles."

Nancy Springer | Associate Director, VFW National Legislative Service

"I think part of it will be a 'showing by doing' and by personal contact with women combat veterans — those currently serving and those no longer serving. I have learned that veterans join VFW to do things that serve veterans, not to sit around and watch TV. Women VFW members should be an active part of their Post's recruiting drives and should serve in Post (and above) officer positions, both appointed and/or elect-

ed. My Post is fortunate in that aspect as it currently has three women Post officers, one woman who serves as a District officer, and recently had a woman commander. I had been an At-Large member for a few years prior to military retirement. I attended a Post meeting where the Post officers approached me to learn my name and to welcome me. I returned and quickly transferred from At-Large status to this Post. A few weeks later, I became a Life member."

Sonia Coley | National Pre-Discharge Claims Representative

"The VFW could attract more women to the organization by doing outreach and letting women know that they are eligible for the VFW. I joined the VFW because I retired with no help from a service officer. I learned that the VFW does claims and wanted to help people that were in my position have an easier transition."

Abigail Heffernan | National Pre-Discharge Claims Representative

"I think that highlighting women more will show that the VFW is not just a men's club. Focus on the diversity and the uniqueness of the individuals that the VFW has within its ranks. I think articles like this are important as well because it sheds light on the fact that there are quite a few women that are in the VFW. I joined the VFW because I was offered a job by the VFW, and I felt I needed to become a member. However, since I became a member, I have found a family. I now tell any veteran I see that they need to join and get involved because it is an amazing group of people."

Denise Southall | National Pre-Discharge Claims Representative

"A lot of women veterans feel that they're not recognized for their service. I feel that programs or events that are specifically designed for women veterans would attract more of them. I joined the VFW because of the claims assistance that I received from Tom Parker, Fort Cavazos National Pre-Discharge Claims Representative, when I retired. I appreciated it so much, and I wanted to pay it forward."

Carol WhitmoreSenior Vice Commander-in-Chief

"The VFW is slowly turning a corner in acceptance. Treat women as any other veteran ... on their merits. When I joined the VFW, I did so because VFW is THE tip of the spear over any other service organization."

Debra Anderson Former VFW Quartermaster General

"Female veterans need to see people like them (in terms of gender, age, and race) to feel comfortable and accepted in the VFW. Otherwise, they see no reason to join. I was invited by a friend and fellow Gulf War veteran to join. I enjoyed the camaraderie and a shared sense of accomplishment. Veteran organizations like the VFW are great for helping you connect with like-minded veterans. You don't know how much fun you'll have until you jump in."

Mary SpencerVFW Unmet Needs Coordinator

"The main thing for me is to present more of a family-friendly atmosphere. Between work and family obligations and our children's schedule, time is very limited. Posts need to be innovative and branch out from what has always worked and create new programs and/or offer some sort of child care during events or meetings. Many service members have families and children and if they see that other children/family members are involved in the VFW community, then that can be a factor in whether they see it as a good fit for their family. I joined the VFW on the recommendation of someone I trust and respect. It also was a way to stay connected to the military when I was done wearing the uniform."

Stephanie Butler Administration Operations Assistant Coordinator

"I believe that having an incoming female Commander-in-Chief is a huge start in attracting more female veterans. The VFW has so much potential with younger veterans, especially female veterans if they would support women the way they have supported men in the past. The VFW could most definitely work with the VA to fix the women's clinic."

Katherine Cassell | Assistant Director of National Veterans Service

"It is important to lead by example, meet them where they are and understand their needs. When I became active in the VFW, I worked with my Post/ Department leadership in having meetings that were family-friendly. It is good for VFW members to recognize that military/veteran children represent more than 63 percent of those who join the military. My initial experience in joining the VFW was initially unfavorable and felt like a slap in the face from the VFW Post that I grew up in as a child. Fast forward 10 years and another move across the country, and I was at a veteran-engaged event sponsored by my university's student veteran program. At that event, I ran into another woman veteran of a VFW Post who was in a leadership role. After talking with her and seeing the positive changes that VFW had made offered me hope, and I joined."

Cindy Noel | Assistant Director, Field Operations, NVS

"Even in 2025, the older male VFW members still don't see us as veterans while we are wearing our hats. At each convention, the female combat veterans like myself are never represented. We are given 45 minutes in a small room with no participation. No men show up to support. I deployed during numerous campaigns — Saudi Arabia, Kosovo, Iraq, Kyrgyzstan, and Kuwait — but none of that counts to my male VFW counterparts who still see me as a girl. We are educated, we served and we are still serving. When female non-members see themselves in the organization, they will come. I joined the VFW after an excellent, patient and kind VSO who assisted with my VA claim prompted me to join the VFW."

Kristina Keenan | Deputy Director of VFW National Legislative Service

"The best way to attract more women veterans to the VFW is to be welcoming and open to all veterans when they walk into a Post for the first time. The VFW does a great job highlighting women veterans in the VFW magazine, on the VFW website and through social media. I was

excited to join the VFW as soon as I was eligible, which was just after my first deployment in the early 2000s. When I returned to the United States and stepped on to American soil, there were veterans from the VFW waiting at the gate. They shook my hand, handed me a cell phone and said, 'Welcome home. Now call your mother and let her know you're OK.' That gesture really moved me, and soon after, I was motivated to join the organization that I had heard about my whole life."

VFW DEPARTMENT COMMANDERS

Kimberly Napoleon | Department of Michigan Commander

"It is imperative that veterans' organizations such as VFW intentionally seek to create safe opportunities for female veterans to share their perspectives. Many female veterans served in male-dominant units and feel isolated when it comes to a male-dominant organization. The newly formed National Women's Veterans Committee by Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt is a start. With representation from each state, female members have the opportunity to develop initiatives that focus on the issues that are most relevant to the female veteran. I joined VFW because I was invited by a Vietnam veteran who happened to be a family friend. I was the only female in my Post, and today I am one of three after 20 years. Furthermore, I am the first female to be elected in 105 years of Department of Michigan's chartering."

Deborah Johnson | Department of California Commander

"Most people assume that it takes women in the VFW to recruit women into the VFW. Although that helps, I have seen a better response with male members telling women their eligibility and their value. Most women are resistant to membership in male-dominated organizations because of their personal experiences in the military. Leadership in the VFW as a woman is very challenging. Although I have been a member for more than 30 years, I still get comments

about why my service or my gender does not qualify me for a leadership position. I returned home from Desert Storm in 1993 and was asked to join a local VFW Post where I lived. It was an honor to be asked to join the VFW because I was not aware that I was eligible since I served in the National Guard."

Andrea Summerlin | Department of Oregon Commander

As the first female commander in our Department's 103-year history, the responsibility is not lost on me that I am a role model. My mentor, John Wrinkle, (past Department Commander and Council member) was a visionary leader. He created the Department's Women's Veterans Committee, and I was the first Chair. The Committee is now chaired by a dynamic and energetic leader, and she is doing outreach, surveys, meetings, has created a resource guide and so much more. Despite us being in the 21st century, the majority of women are still primarily responsible for child care and household duties. Having child care for meetings would be helpful as well as having meetings at convenient times. Not all women will be like I was, seeking out the VFW, and that is why it's so important to spread our message to others. Ignore the naysayers and be a part of the team."

Barbara Loncar | Department of Pennsylvania Commander

"When having a recruiting event, seek out the females in the crowd. Don't just ask the males because they are wearing a veteran hat or shirt. I was raised in the VFW starting as a Junior Girl then transferred to Auxiliary at 16. My mom's family were very active in our VFW. When my husband and I came back from Desert Storm, my uncle was the Post Commander. He encouraged us to join the VFW. Join so you can help keep your VA benefits. We encourage members to attend meetings, but if the female veterans are raising a family, it isn't easy. We need to have Posts provide child care during meetings."





'A Valuable and Noble Profession With Purpose'

A VFW member from Rhode Island spearheaded a gardening program to assist veterans interested in farming. She believes it offers the necessary knowledge and skills for success.

verwhelmed by the pressures at work and the birth of her second child in 2017, Tricia Lourenco Boucher sought a reprieve from her mounting PTSD and anxiety symptoms.

A member of the Air Force Reserve at the time, Boucher turned to the VA for help and, through several treatment options, discovered that the act of gardening outdoors cultivated the most profound sense of catharsis.

"I found getting my hands in the soil and using my body to dig, crawl and haul things around the yard really helped me to process my big feelings," said Boucher, the senior vice commander for VFW Post 916 in Wakefield, R.I. "Plus, the reward of smelling sweet flowers and eating delicious ripe fruits and vegetables with my little ones made my heart happy."

These mental health benefits prompted Boucher, who served with the Rhode Island Army National Guard, the Army, and the Air Force Reserve from 2000 to 2011, to shift her career focus.

After earning a bachelor's degree in psychology while in the Reserve, Boucher returned to the University of Rhode Island (URI) in Kingston to pursue a second bachelor's degree in 2020, this time in plant science and sustainable crop production.

"The goal was to learn about plants, so that I could connect veterans with gardening so they, too, could heal," said Boucher, who deployed in 2004 with the Army's 1st Infantry Division to Tikrit, Iraq. "I started working at the URI agronomy farm, assisting with

vegetable crop research and growing vegetables for students to study and for donation to the on-campus free farmers market and local food pantries."

Boucher also completed the URI Master Gardeners Training program and became a master gardener program coordinator at URI's Teaching Garden, which provided her with the necessary experience to take a step closer to helping fellow veterans.

When she graduated in 2023, Boucher promptly applied for a Department of Agriculture grant to launch a veteran-friendly program called Boots-2-Bushels through the URI Cooperative Extension in 2024. The program offers comprehensive nine-month market gardening training courses specifically designed for beginning farmers, military veterans and their families.

Boots-2-Bushels provides New England-based veterans and beginning farmers courses in the winter and spring, taught by agricultural experts from across the Northeast. These experts connect participants with knowledge and resources to build a business plan and marketing strategy and develop scientific growing practices, among other things.

Winter courses run from Jan. 21 through March 27, with classes held via Zoom on Tuesday and Thursday

evenings from 6 to 7:30 p.m. In the spring and summer, the courses also offer optional farm tours and workshops across Rhode Island and Maine, expanding on opportunities to learn and build relationships with farmers.

"I am grateful that this program provides an opportunity for veterans to enter the world of agriculture and build relationships with each other and the tight-knit farming community," said Boucher, who serves as program coordinator. "Growing food for our neighbors and stewarding the land is a valuable and noble profession with purpose. It requires grit, determination and skill, which are values deeply embedded in our veterans. I have high hopes that this program will continue to grow and continue to serve as a hub of knowledge and community."

Applications to participate in 2025 classes opened last fall and closed by Dec. 31.




